

Behavioral Insights for Low Uptake of

HIV Testing in Georgia

HIV self-testing (HIVST) is the process by which a person takes an HIV test using a simple oral or blood-based test. This is a relatively new approach that allows people to explore themselves in a confidential and comfortable environment. This is a special opportunity, for those who would not otherwise have been tested for HIV particularly for high-risk populations, to learn about their HIV status.

The project aims at benefiting public health by reducing the risk of transmitting HIV by uptake of HIV testing in Georgia, through the transfer of Czech expertise in evidence-based policymaking and piloting behavioral data-based solutions.

The project envisages the use of experimental research methods, including the implementation of a randomized controlled trial using the principles of behavioral science, development of concept and design which involves all key stakeholders, both government and non-governmental sector representatives and experts in the field.

TARGET GROUPS

Individuals aged 18-34 who will participate in а project-based randomized study and undergo HIV self-testing.

EXPECTED RESULTS

Resources for evidence-based policymaking related to HIV testing prepared and handed over to NCDC, such as:

- ✓ self-testing protocol for stiamaadvisory and free service provision in collaboration with HIV testing/self-testing support service providers
- ✓ Randomized Control Trial

lncrease capacities of health professionals and peer counselors to provide stigma-free counseling on HIV self-testing.

🞗 Conduct a communication campaign and animations, create messages with the potential to increase awareness and motivation of people to conduct HIV selftesting using dedicated website and remote services.
